Program Abstract:

Some research has shown a relationship between creativity and IQ, whereas other research

has shown creativity to be independent from IQ. The threshold theory provides one explanation

for this discrepancy, and states that there is a consistent relationship between IQ and creativity

for scores lower than IQ 120, but that the correlation dissipates among scores above IQ 120.

This study will synthesize empirical research on creativity and intelligence to test the threshold

theory and to find a generalization about the relationship between creativity and intelligence.
