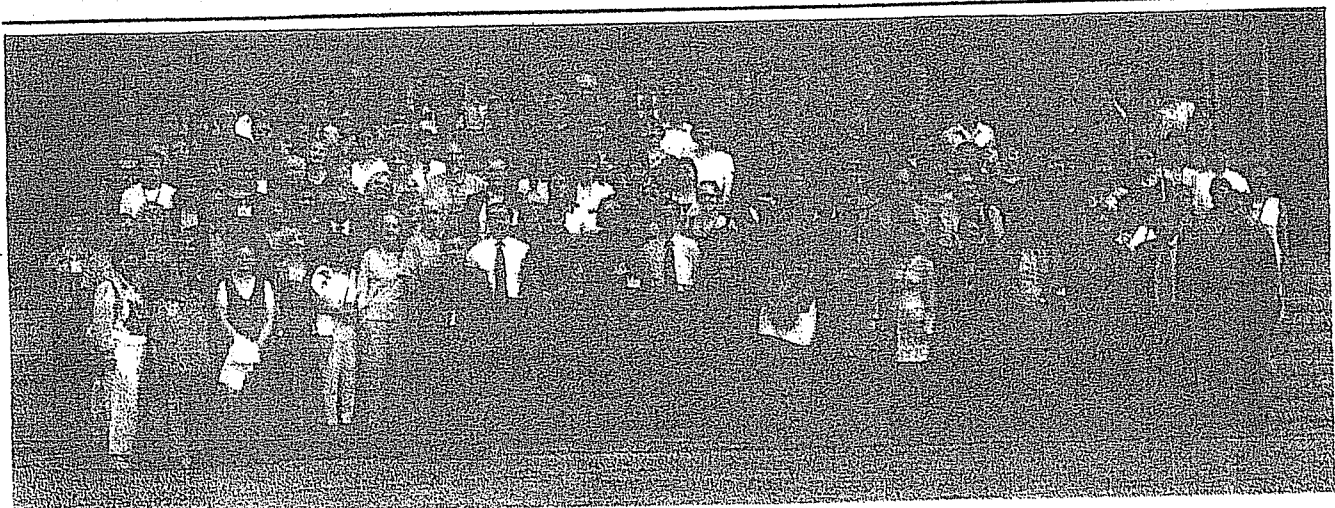

You may have also received a message from your ICP on-site mentor. They gathered comments and questions from persons viewing your poster and offer their summary of that on-site exchange to encourage you in your research, thinking, and presenting.

Should award winners be able to fund their attendance at the 2005 conference in Brazil, there will be a time allocated for a verbal presentation. An award winner able to join us in Brazil is to notify the President or one of the In-Absentia chairs before March 2005.

The "call for proposals" for the 2005 In-Absentia Posters will be made early in 2005. The Board is likely to expand the award categories for 2005. In-Absentia Graduate Students: International Psychology and General Psychology. Local Graduate Students: International Psychology and General Psychology.

A third category of display posters is to be for Career Psychologists: International Psychology and General Psychology. Types or amounts of awards for each group have not been determined.

The award for the best graduate student essay on the theme of the 2005 convention will also be given. That theme will be announced later.
