- * an **Individual** session presentation you, along with any secondary presenters, will have the entire one-hour timeslot for your presentation.
- * a **Combined** session presentation you, along with any secondary presenters, will share the one-hour timeslot with another presentation.
- * a **Poster** session presentation you, along with any secondary presenters, will share your information in a gallery format with several similar topics offered simultaneously, where the audience moves from presentation to presentation. You will be notified of the day, time and location at a later date
- * a **Putting It Into Practice** session presentation, you, along with any secondary presenters, will have a 45-minute timeslot for your presentation due to its special scheduling within the lunch time block. A Putting it Into Practice session is designed to provide practical resources and hands on experiences for conferees.
- * If your proposal has been placed on the **Wait List**, then you could be scheduled as any of the types of sessions listed above. We will notify you when we are able to schedule your presentation.

IMPORTANT PRESENTER INFORMATION

Presenters must register for the Convention in order to conduct your session and have your name appear in the convention program. The deadline for presenters to register is September 1, 2009. More convention information, including housing, is available at www.nacgc.org.

Presenters are responsible for securing and paying for their own travel, lodging, and meals.

Having been selected from over 950 submissions, your presentation will make an important contribution to the quality of the convention and the information provided for the participants.
